

Dr Anthony White, MBE

Tony White is an Executive Director of Climate Change Capital. Tony has been involved in almost all aspects of the energy industry, ranging from renewable energy research through to strategy, finance, international development and policy. He has made major contributions to the evolution of the industry during this time. Having helped the UK Government privatise and restructure the England & Wales electricity industry in 1990, he recognised the different role required of network companies serving competitive power markets. This led to the introduction of the Transmission services scheme in England & Wales and was the driving force behind the UK Government's recent review of distributed generation. He has also been at the forefront of understanding the impact of liberalisation on the generation sector, correctly forecasting the path of power prices in Europe and the USA. He was a founding member of the UK Government's Energy Advisory Panel, a member of the National Grid's Executive Committee and Head of the European Utility Research teams at Kleinwort Benson and Citigroup. This team was recognised by Extel in 2002 as being the world's best sector team covering European Companies and also led the research for the privatisations of Enel, Endesa, MVV, REE, Snam, and Enagas. He is a non-Executive Director of the New and Renewable Centre at Blyth, UK and a member of the British Government's Commission on Environmental Markets and Economic Performance and of the High Level Stakeholders' Group for the Built Environment. In 2004, he was awarded an MBE "for services to UK Energy Policy".
